Happy Summer Season to Our Volunteers and Supporters!

Much has happened over the last quarter: A trip to Mohegan Sun, a visit from Governor Shumlin to meet us all and dedicate the Green Mountain Nature Trail, and many outdoor activities. Your efforts continue to improve the lives of others by bringing the community to Thompson House. I can't tell you how many residents stop by to comment on the quality of the activities. Singing, baking, lecturing, ministering, and even gambling all make for a better day for the residents of Thompson House, every day. Thank you for giving of yourself.

I wanted to take this opportunity to write about a recent initiative from the Brattleboro Mutual Aid Association Board of Directors regarding our community involvement. Under their direction, in the past two years Thompson House has begun to shift our business to local companies. We seek and continue to find local sources for our supplies, and have changed to local vendors for our largest accounts, including uniforms and linens, office supplies, and vending. We began purchasing furniture and equipment like washing machines, dryers, room furnishings, and vacuum cleaners from local businesses. Last year, we moved all of our banking to local banks to do our part in helping Brattleboro and the surrounding towns use those dollars to stimulate business locally. We want people to know that when they give to Thompson House, those dollars stay in the local economy. We are hosting two upcoming fundraisers to continue our mission in the community:

1. Our annual activities fundraiser at the Vermont Welcome Center is on September 9th, and we are still looking for snacks, baked goods, drink donations, and volunteers. Please contact Sandy Ware at extension #242 if you wish to volunteer or donate any items for this cause. All proceeds from this event will directly benefit our residents through the Activity Program.
2. The Thompson House 3rd Annual Splash-A-Thon (formerly the Swim-A-Thon) is being held at the Colonial Pool and Spa on Sunday, September 11th. This year, there will be something for everybody: we will be having food, fun, and games for the whole family. The proceeds from this year's event will go to the Cooler and Greener Project. This project will provide air conditioning and heat for our 60 residents in their rooms and common areas to improve quality of life and respiratory health, and to open up windows for needed sunlight and views of the outdoors in Summer. ALTHOUGH YOU ARE ALL VERY SPECIAL and do a phenomenal job with our residents, all of us can use reminders now and then.

- ★ When communicating with our folks, please be aware who is hard of hearing, who may be cognitively impaired, and who may have visual impairments or other barriers which may impact the way in which they respond.
- ★ Make sure you are aware of any and all dietary restrictions before serving residents any food or drinks. Do their liquids need to be thickened? Can they feed themselves?
- ★ Remember, nicknames are only permitted with the residents' approval.
- ★ If taking residents outside, please be aware that some of our folks take medications that make them very susceptible to sunburns. Make sure they get sun tan lotion on exposed skin.
- ★ Be aware of the need for good hand hygiene.
